1. FFPOS TUITION FEE 2025

The tuition fees listed are for students wishing to enrol in the College as a Full Fee-Paying Overseas Student (FFPOS) on a Student Visa (Subclass 500).

To secure a place at the College fees for 1 semester is paid as a deposit (unless other arrangements are made)

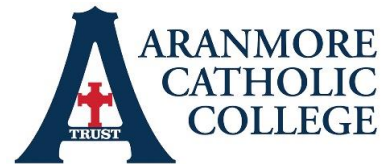
Payment of fees: Payment of fees occur twice a year in June and December. Fees can be paid via bank transfer or global payment platforms such as flywire (pay.flywire.com)

2. AMENITIES FEES

In addition to the tuition charges, all students prior to starting at the college must contribute to the amenities fees.

The intention for this upfront payment is to cover all educational related costs for the student including:

- Books and stationery for the academic year (estimate \$500 - \$600)
- School uniform (estimate \$1,000 including summer, winter and sports uniform)
- Camps/retreats
- Excursions and Incursions
- Graduation/School Ball (Yr 11 and 12)/ River Cruise (Yr10) and other school activities
- Government WACE Examination and certification fees (year 10, 11 and 12 approx. \$250 or \$550)



3. ENGLISH REQUIREMENTS FOR DIRECT ENTRY

Previous academic results as well as recommendations from English proficiency test reports will be used during the enrolment process.

If a student does not meet direct entry requirements can study English at a High school preparation programs (HSP) such as at Phoenix Academy, a 5-minute drive from the College. Students ought to apply directly to HSP programs directly.

Year 10 Test 65+

Year 11 Test 75+

Students are advised to study at an ELICOS provider prior to starting at Aranmore Catholic College if the recommended levels are not met.

4. Overseas Health Insurance Cover (OSHC)

Health is crucial to any student's life when overseas. All students under the student 500 VISA are required to hold the Overseas Student Health Cover for the duration of their studies. Confirmation of the purchase of the OSHC must be provided to the College prior to the start date and can be arranged with any insurance companies including Ahm OSHC, Medibank or Allianz.

Families are to organise the OSHC independently.

5. APPLICATION OR COLLEGE ENROLMENT FEES

Aranmore Catholic College does **not** attract an application fee for FFPOS students. This is a complimentary service for all students enrolling at the College.

6. ACCOMODATION OPTIONS

The school does not have boarding facilities. During their studies at the College, students under 18 must **either** stay with an authorised homestay family through AHN or reside with a relative/immediate family member nominated by the parent, that is of good character and over the age of 21.

If students stay with a homestay, the family are required to apply through the external provider, Australian Homestay Network (AHN). Students **must** use the airport transport service by AHN when they first arrive in Perth unless the College has been notified of other arrangements.

7. DISCOUNTS AND SCHOLARSHIPS
